

What is INSPIRE?

INSPIRE stands for Investing in Neighborhoods and Schools to Promote Improvement, Revitalization, and Excellence.

The Department of Planning is working with communities in a **quarter-mile area** (about **a five minute walk**) around each 21st Century School to create a plan that can guide new private and public investments in each area.



What is INSPIRE?

The scope for each INSPIRE plan includes:

- 1. Area-Specific Recommendations
- 2. Community Improvement Project (\$100K)
- 3. Primary Walking Routes Improvements

Primary walking routes will be identified by

February 2023.

- Invest in Housing & Market-Strengthening
 Opportunities
- 2. Create Connections & Access
- 3. Improve Public Safety
- 4. Create Opportunities for Health & Wellness
- **5.** Create Environmentally-Sustainable & Clean Neighborhoods

What are primary walking route improvements?



What do the walking route improvements include?

Improvements include:

- Repairing uneven and damaged sidewalks
- Repainting faded crosswalks
- Installing new crosswalks
- Installing or repairing accessibility ramps
- Planting and pruning trees









What don't the walking route improvements include?


Sidewalk repairs and crosswalk replacement take place on the designated primary walking routes only—not across all area streets.

Improvements are funded by the INSPIRE program—there is no cost to adjacent property owners.

Additional repairs or road safety improvements may be included in the plan recommendations but may take time for the Department of Transportation to fund and complete.

Where are the primary walking routes?





February 28, 2023: Deadline to receive additional community feedback on proposed Primary Walking Routes.

March 2023: Submit proposed Primary Walking Routes to DOT.

Summer-Fall 2023: Primary Walking Route improvements underway.
