SUSTAINABLE COMMUNITIES ACT

- Passed by the Maryland General Assembly in 2010
- The Sustainable Communities supports reinvestment and revitalization in older communities by renewing and enhancing the "Rehabilitation Tax Credit" and by simplifying and targeting existing State program resources into a single designation.





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SUSTAINABLE COMMUNITIES ACT

What's New

- Transit Oriented Development Zones (TOD) and Base Realignment and Closure Zones (BRAC). These areas are automatically considered Sustainable Communities effective June 1, 2010 and do not need to be renewed.
- Effective June 1, 2010, all Community Legacy Areas and Designated Neighborhoods became Sustainable Communities and do need to be renewed every five years.





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SUSTAINABLE COMMUNITY BENEFITS

- Community Legacy provides funding for essential projects aimed at strengthening communities through a range of activities such as business retention and attraction, encouraging homeownership, and commercial revitalization.
- Neighborhood BusinessWorks Program. Loan program provides gap financing to new or expanding small businesses and nonprofit organizations in Sustainable Communities throughout the State.





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SUSTAINABLE COMMUNITY BENEFITS

- MDOT Sidewalk Retrofit Program This program helps finance the construction and replacement of sidewalks along state highways. This program IS NOT Available in the City of Baltimore.
- DBED Job Creation Tax Credit Enhanced incentives in Sustainable Communities: The maximum tax credit rises from \$1,000 to \$1,500 per employee; the threshold to qualify drops from 60 to 25 jobs created.





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SUSTAINABLE COMMUNITY BENEFITS

• Sustainable Communities Tax Credit Program:

Maintains existing historic tax credits in their current form (20% credit) and grants an **additional 5%** credit for historic buildings certified as LEED Gold

Expands the commercial credit (10%) to include qualified rehab of non-historic structures in **Main Street Communities** beginning in fiscal 2011 and newly designated Sustainable Communities in fiscal 2012

\$10 million is available in fiscal 2011 for the Tax Credit
Program and non-historic structures will be eligible for
10% of the appropriated amount in a given fiscal year



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

Adopted Sustainable Community Boundaries:









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



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

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


