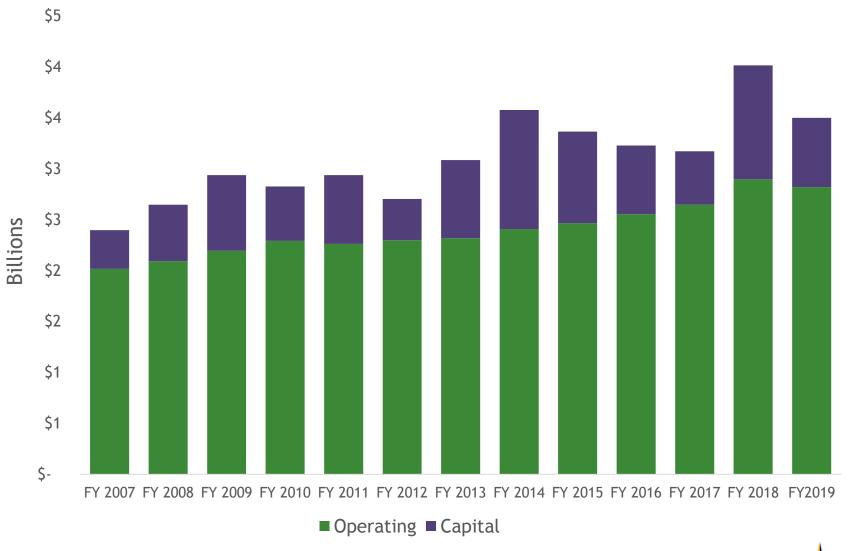

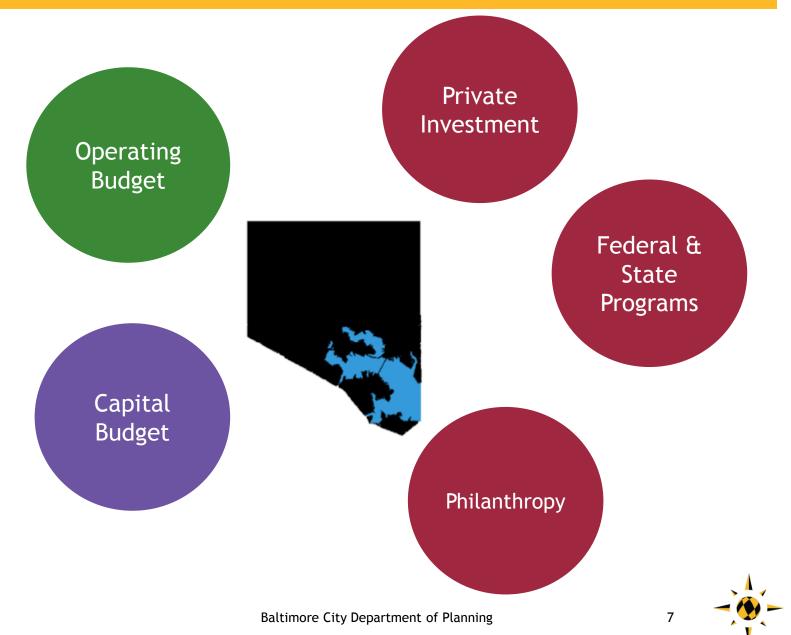

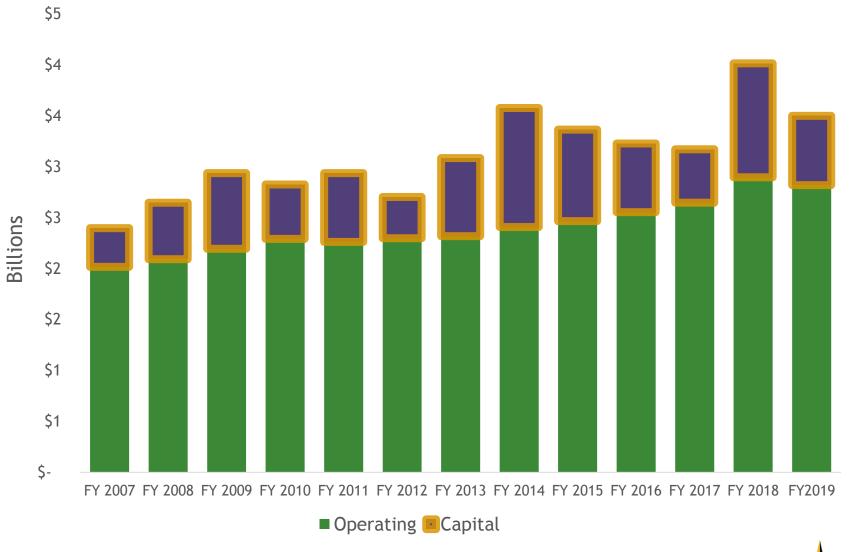

## **Budget History (Operating and Capital)**



#### **CIP Overview**

- By City Charter, the Planning Commission must submit a recommendation for the six-year
   Capital Improvement Program (CIP) to the Board of Estimates
- The <u>first year</u> of the CIP becomes the basis for the capital component of the Ordinance of Estimates (budget), adopted by City Council
- The six-year CIP begins again each year.

#### **Capital Project Requirements**

Per Board of Estimates (BOE) policy, a capital improvement is:

- Physical betterment or improvement and any preliminary studies relative thereto
- NOT:
  - Improvements costing less than \$50,000
  - Vehicular equipment
  - Repairs or maintenance costing less than \$100,000, or emergency in nature
  - Salaries other than those which are properly capitalized as part of the cost of the project

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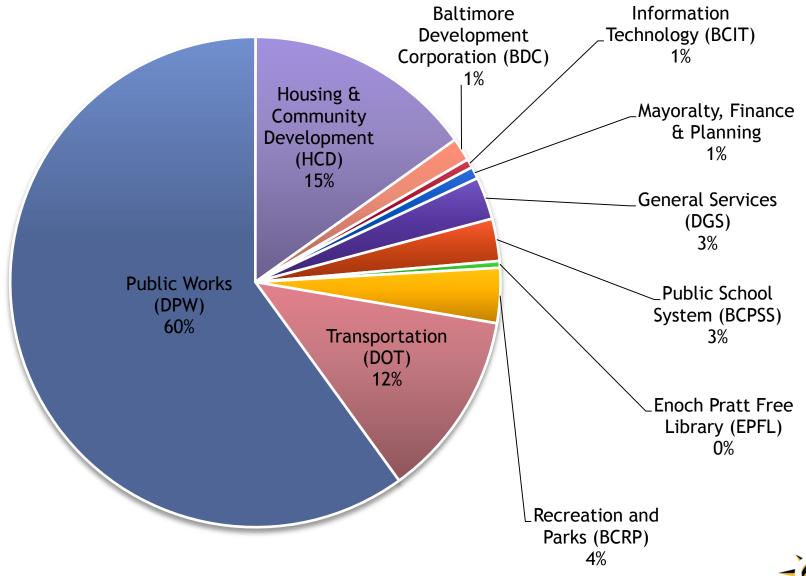

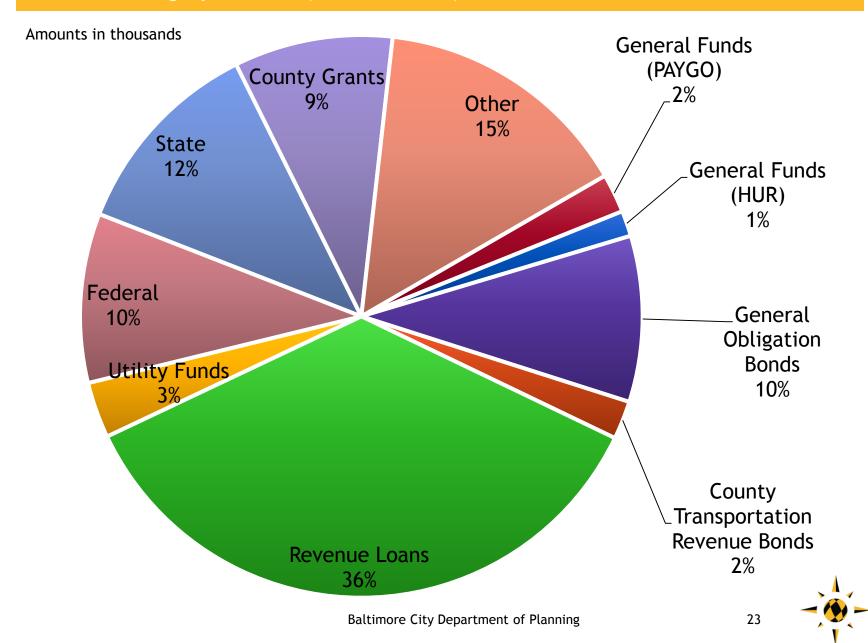

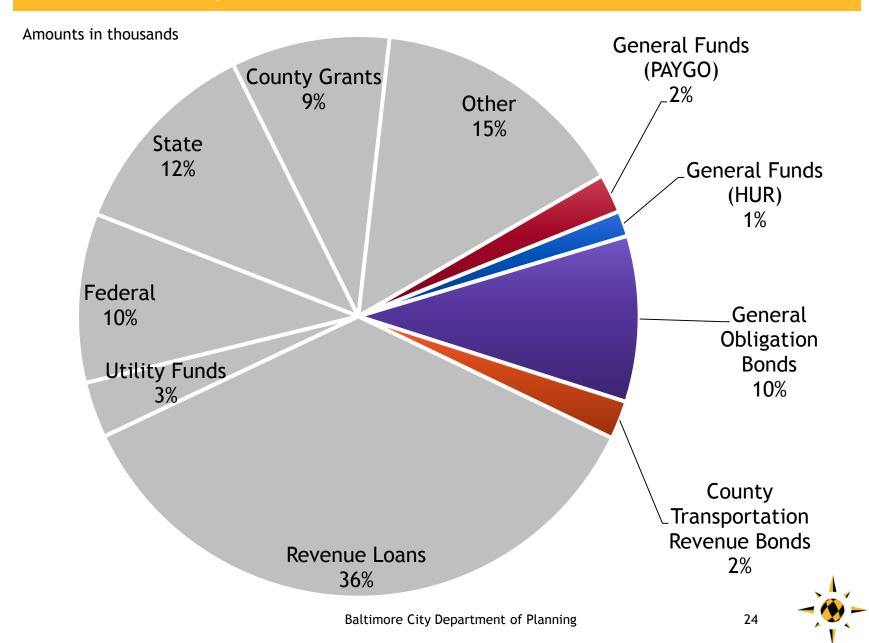
#### FY19 Funding by Agency (\$681 million)



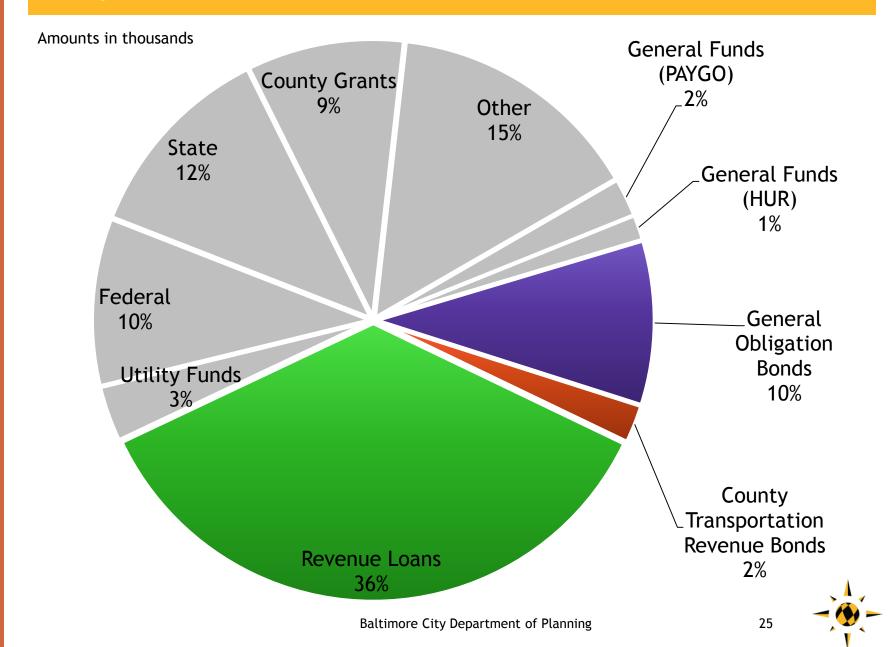
### FY19 Funding by Source (\$681 million)



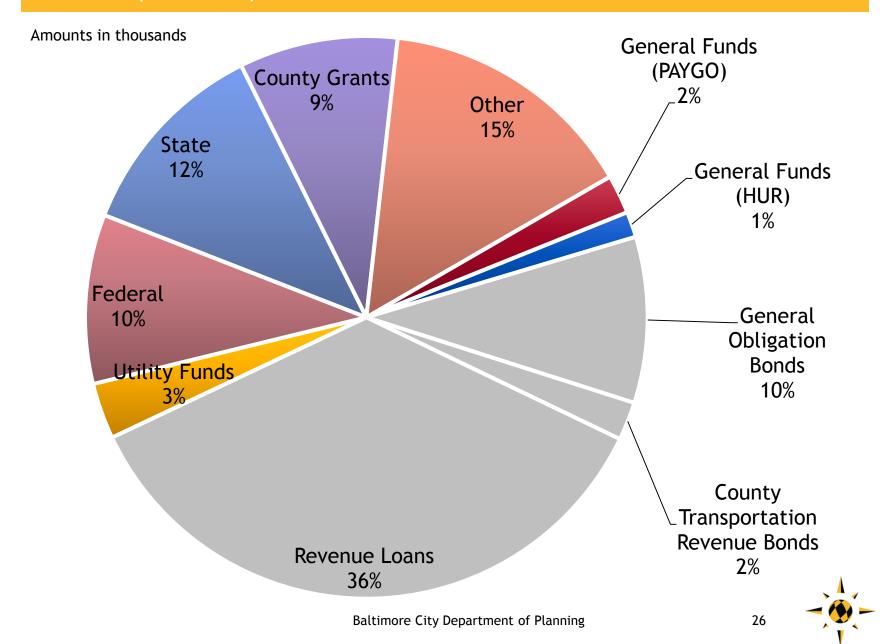

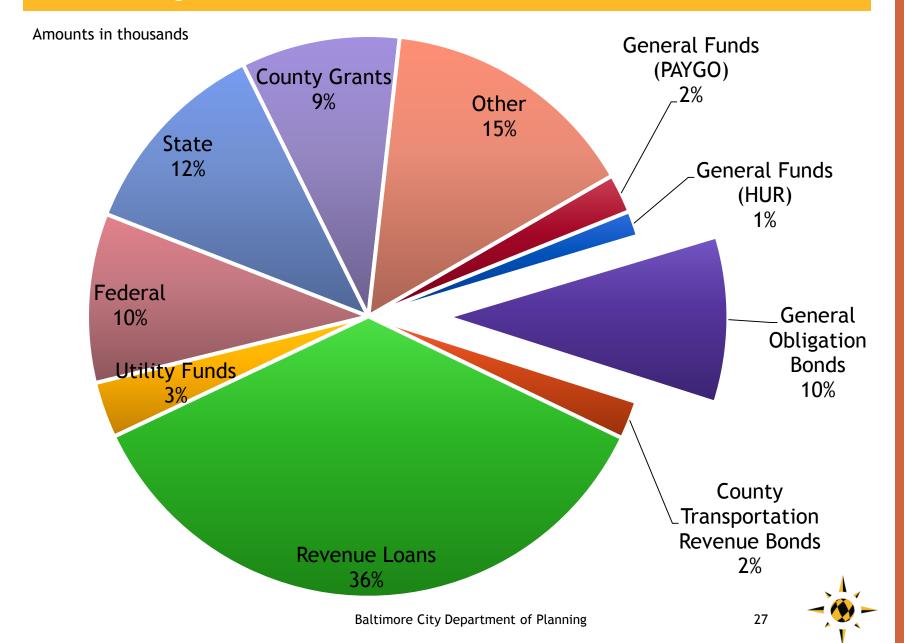

#### 2018 Loan Authorization

#### Question A: Affordable Housing Loan

\$10,000,000 over 2 years

Eligible uses of this new loan include acquisition, preservation, production of new housing, demolition, rental assistance, housing counseling and project finance comprised of loans or grants as well as other related activities.

#### **Question B: Schools Loan**

\$38,000,000 over 2 years

Provides funding for dozens of systemic improvements to City school buildings (roofs, HVAC, windows, etc.) along with a few major renovations, replacements and additions.

#### Question C: Community and Economic Development Loan \$47,000,000 over 2 years

Provides funding for a range of community and economic development uses from renovation of cultural institutions and other community assets to acquisition and demolition of vacant homes.

#### Question D: Parks and Public Facilities Loan

\$65,000,000 over 2 years

Provides funding to improve public buildings and land, including libraries, parks, recreation centers, court buildings, fire stations, municipal buildings, information technology infrastructure, and other city-owned properties.

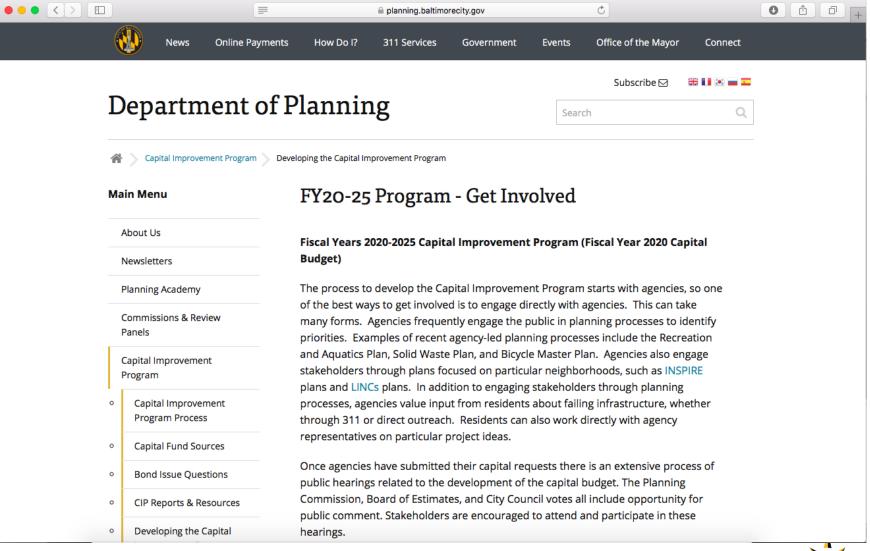
### Capital Improvement Program

### About the Capital Improvement Program

To guide the City in making necessary physical improvements, the City Charter requires the Planning Commission to annually recommend a six-year Capital Improvement Program (CIP) to the Board of Estimates. Each year, the Planning Department works with the various City agencies to prepare and present a new six-year program. The first year of the six-year program is the budget year and becomes the basis for the capital component of the Ordinance of Estimates (budget), adopted by City Council. City Council votes to approve the Ordinance of Estimates, and can remove funds from a project or program but cannot add funds for any purpose.

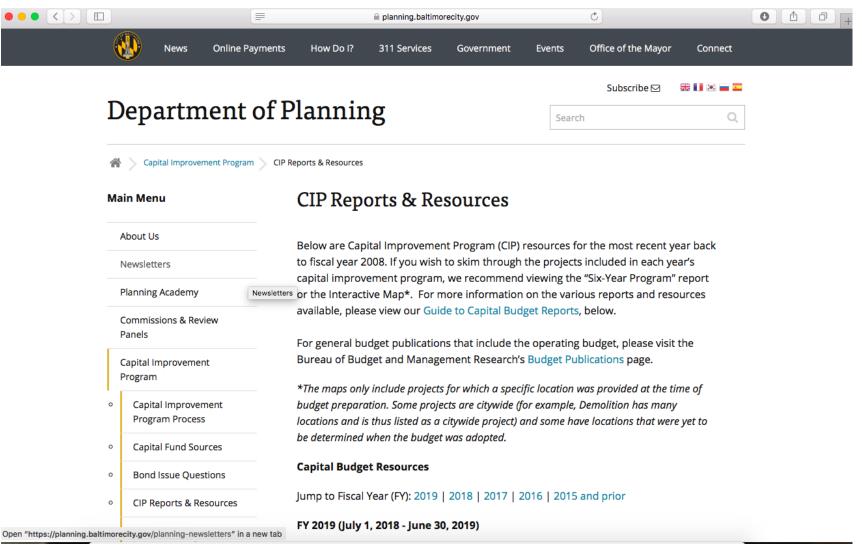
The capital budget is the budget for capital improvements in the City. A capital improvement is a long-term investment, typically in physical infrastructure, such as roads, monuments, public buildings, parks, or art. Capital improvements are defined by the Board of Estimates as "... any physical betterment or improvement and any preliminary studies and surveys relative thereto, including, but not limited to, any property of a permanent nature, and equipment needed in connection with such improvement, when first erected or acquired."

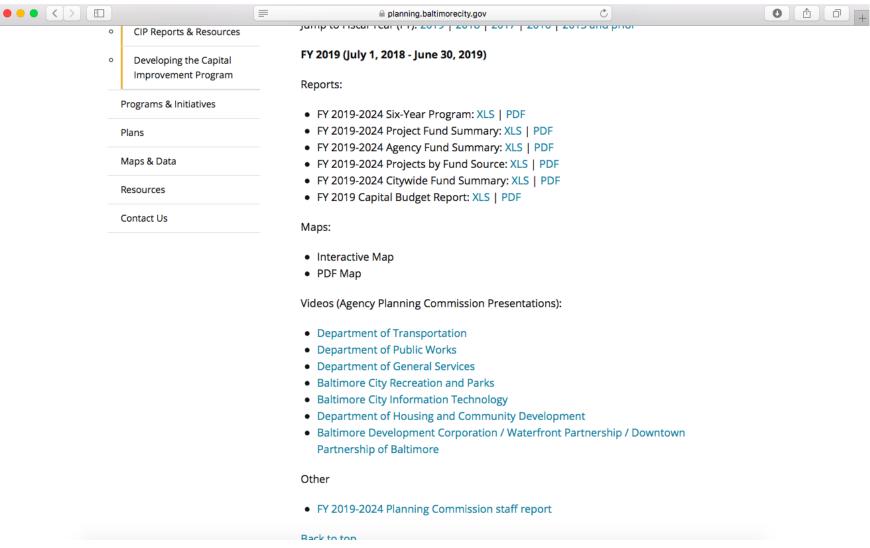

- **Projects by Fund Source:** All projects funded with a particular fund source (e.g. bonds, general funds, utility funds, etc.)
- Citywide Fund Summary: Totals by type of funding.
- Capital Budget Report: Shows changes as the budget progressed through the approvals process - see what was requested by agencies versus what was eventually funded.
