Pursuant to Chapter 464 of 2014, I am pleased to submit this Fiscal Year 2024 Q1-Q3 Quarterly Spending Report for the City of Baltimore's allocation of Maryland State Local Impact Grant (LIG) monies through Baltimore's Casino Local Impact Fund (CLIF) program for the South Baltimore Casino Impact Area.

FY24 was our largest-ever CLIF Spending Plan budget, which includes the <u>Original FY24 Spending Plan</u> and the <u>FY24 Supplemental Spending Plan</u>. Highlights of spending through Q3 include-

- Capital allocations of \$2,500,000 each for <u>Solo Gibbs Park</u> and the <u>Warner-Stockholm Complete Streets Project aka "The Walk@Warner Street"</u> which will support the emerging stadium and entertainment district between M&T Bank Stadium and the Horseshoe Casino
- Middle Neighborhoods Strategy in Cherry Hill and Lakeland (Community Development)
- Clean Corps in Westport (Benefit District Support)
- Continued support of the Mayor's Office of Employment Development's <u>South Baltimore Employment Connection Center</u> (Employment Connection (MOED))
- Continued support of cleaning and greening of the Middle Branch of the Patapsco River. (Cleaning Waterways)
