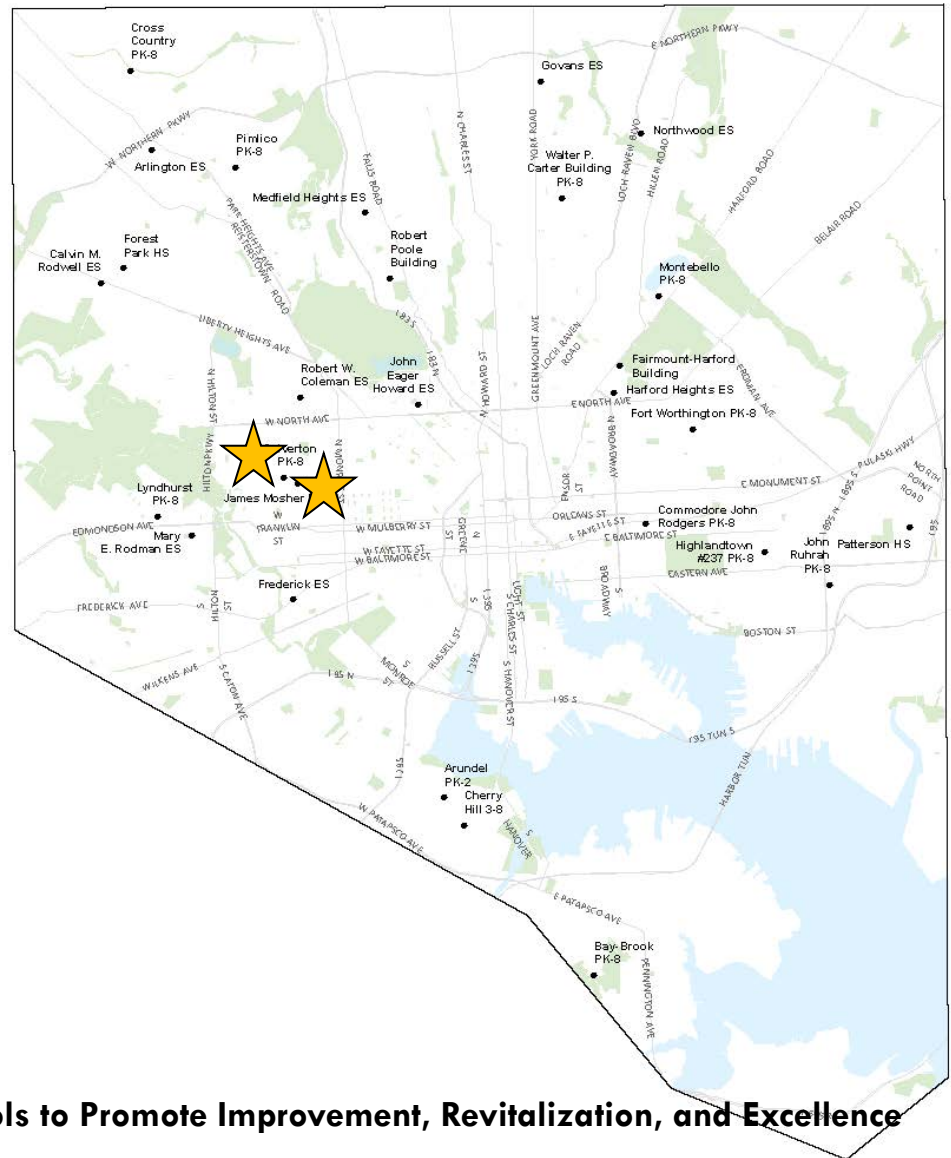
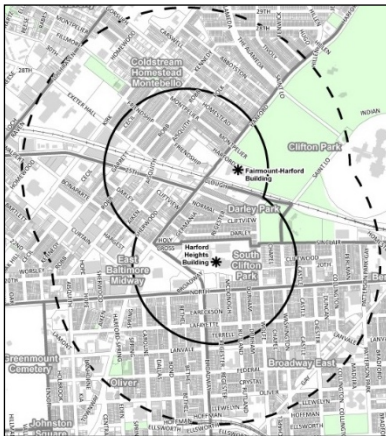

- A **plan** to improve quality of life and guide community's long-term vision
- A **process** to develop and begin to implement the plan
- A **budget item** in CIP – city investments

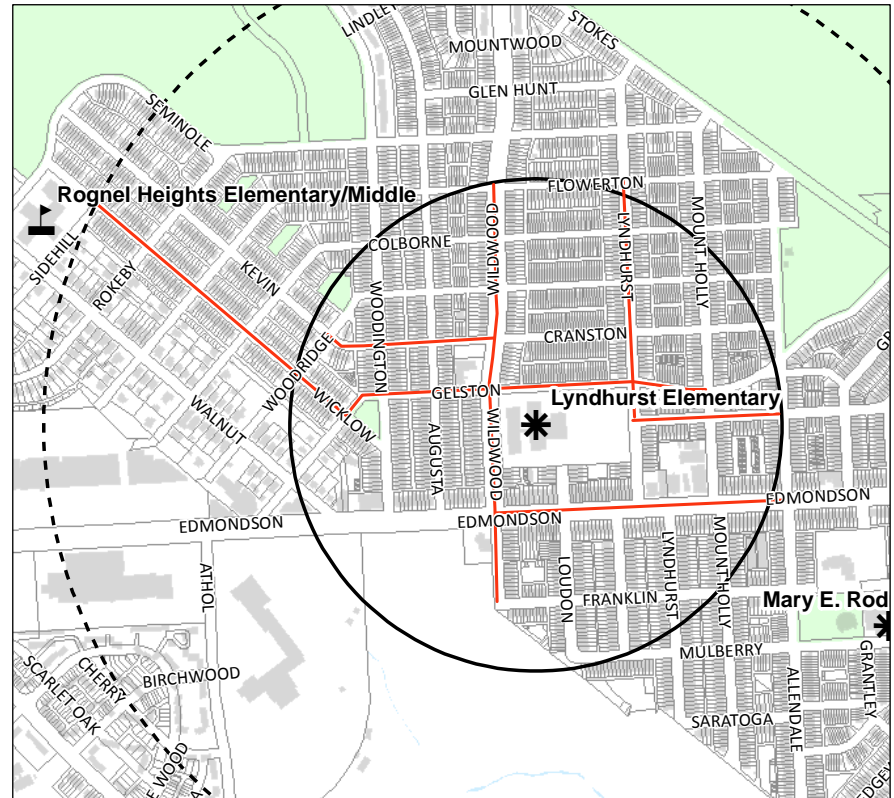

Standard Improvements

Preparing for Opening Day

- Bringing sidewalks up to safe/standard condition
- Repainting/adding crosswalks
- Assessing need for repairs to ADA ramps at intersections
- Pruning and planting street trees
- Assessing crossing guard deployment
- Boarding open vacant buildings
- Removing trash and cleaning vacant lots

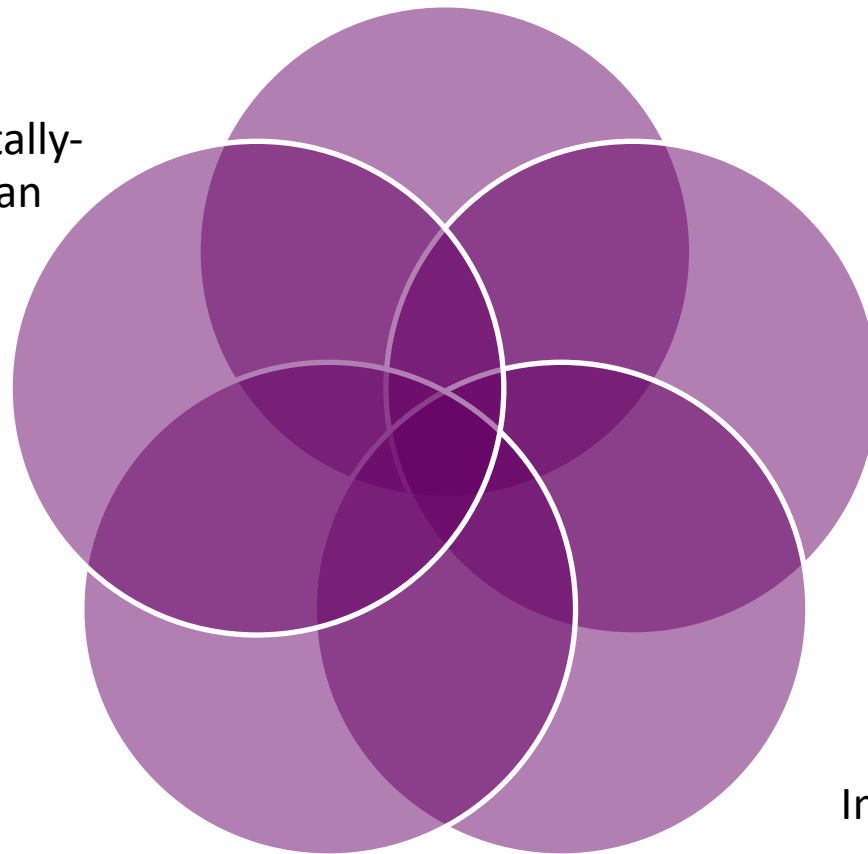

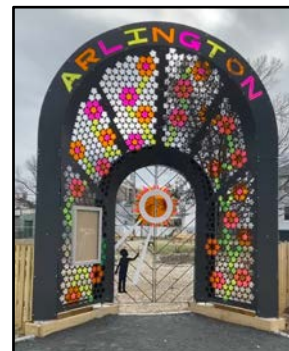

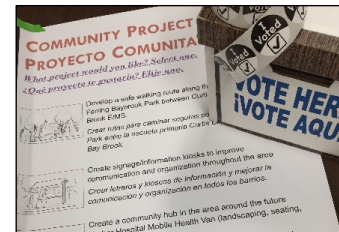
