Pimlico Racetrack Redevelopment

- Maryland Thoroughbred Racetrack Operating Authority (MTROA),
 Maryland Stadium Authority (MSA) and project partners developing site plan and design.
- Timeline for redevelopment
 - Demo of non-essential structures starts September 1
 - Pauses April 2025 for 150th Preakness
 - Preakness held in Laurel in 2026
 - Returns to Pimlico in 2027
- HB 1524 also requires a **plan for community development** in neighborhoods surrounding the racetrack.
 - Plan development coordinated by State DHCD and MTROA.
 - Builds on work led by Pimlico Community Advisory Board, community members, and partners over the past several years.
 - Study area includes Park Heights Master Plan Area and One Mile Radius.



Pimlico Racetrack Redevelopment

- Plan for community development includes recommendations, timelines, and funding targets for:
 - Housing (workforce, affordable, blight/vacancy, homeownership)
 - Commercial Revitalization
 - Community Safety and Beautification
 - Workforce Development and Job Training
- Recommendations will draw from existing community and master plans, strategic plans, and vision plans.
 - E.g., Park Heights Master Plan, INSPIRE Plans, NWCPF Revitalization Plan, BRNI Revitalization Plan
 - E.g., strategic and community planning work led by PHR, CHAI, Northwest Baltimore Partnership, and Pimlico Community Advisory

FY26 SPENDING PLAN PROCESS AND SCHEDULE

Process

- New: hard deadline of October 18, 2024.
- New: cure period and technical review will allow for corrections.
- New: minimum funding request of \$25,000 per project.
- Eligible projects required to show complete scope of work, budget information (sources and uses), timelines, project types, and project outcomes.
- This ensures that the PCDA and City can make more informed decisions and that the community can respond to complete project proposals.
- Also ensures the City can distribute funding quickly because we already have information needed to execute grant agreements



Process

Request form includes eligibility criteria and review
of grantees to ensure organizations in good standing
and that funds will be allocated to organizations with
the capacity to administer program or have a fiscal
sponsor.



- All projects required to show measurable activity, performance targets and goals which will now be included in contracts so that City, PCDA, and community will be able to much more clearly track outcomes of funding.
- All projects required to show alignment with current master plans or community plans.
- Quarterly reports provide expenditure and project progress.



Process

- New: Applicants now invited to testify/give comment at PCDA work session. Ensures a more level playing field between agencies, high-capacity groups, and emerging organizations.
- New: Equity question updated per feedback from PCDA. Application now includes question about alignment with Department of Planning's Equity Lens (structural, procedural, distributional, and/or transgenerational equity).
- **New:** Northwest Neighborhood Grants Program is now duplicated for the Park Heights Master Plan area.
- Data show trend of allocation of higher proportion of funding to emerging organizations in recent years.



Operating funds for agency-led projects are appropriated to specific agency (e.g., MOED).

Operating funds for partner-led projects are appropriated to Planning (e.g., Agrihood).

Capital funds for partner-led projects are appropriated to DHCD (e.g. Park West Capital Expansion).

Capital funds for agency-led projects are appropriated to specific agency (e.g., Enoch Pratt for Library).

All funds from City to Partners must have contracts, including scopes of work and budgets, MBE/WBE compliance review, Risks review, Audits review, Board of estimates review.

All grantees must file quarterly reports with the City who then files with the State.

Accountability/transparency is a condition of City-administered funding.

Evaluation Criteria

- Alignment with State Law § 9-1A-31, including:
 - Infrastructure improvements
 - Facilities
 - Public safety
 - Sanitation
 - Economic and community development, including housing
 - Other public services and improvements
- Applicant eligibility as determined by tax-exempt status, fiscal capacity, and past grant compliance.
- Alignment with relevant master plans, community plans, area strategies, and City, PCDA, and community priorities.
- Project readiness as determined through scope of work, budget, and timeline.
- Outcomes/Impact as determined by equity response and performance measures.




FY21-25: 5 Year Pimlico Local Impact Aid - Capital & Operating Investments



- Capital projects are the bulk of spending across the past 5 years and across three categories: **Housing, Community Development**, and **Parks/Recreation**.
- There's also been an increase in operating expenses, both as a proportion of the overall funding, and number of operating awards.
- Within operating, Business and Economic Development and Organizational Support/Capacity Building are the greatest shares of funding.




FY21-25: 5 Year Pimlico Local Impact Aid - New & Continuing Projects



 Trend over past three years has shifted from old/recurring/multiyear projects to new projects.




FY21-25: 5 Year Pimlico Local Impact Aid - Focus Areas



- Transportation has not been allocated funding since FY22.
- Parks & Recreation and Housing have seen the greatest investment over the past five years. Community Development is inclusive of \$2 million dollars for the Library.
- Business & Economic Development is a recent investment with support from the Mayor's Office of Small Business Advocacy & Development

FY21-25: 5 Year Pimlico Local Impact Aid - Housing Investments



- Housing investments are inclusive of new construction, vacancy/blight elimination, and homeownership preservation.
- Homeownership preservation investment from FY21-25 includes \$2.1 million in homeownership repair grants.

 - ~\$20M to DHCD for Major Redevelopment Area (MRA)
 - ~4.5M Park Heights Library
 - ~\$4.8M to BCRP for CC Jackson, Towanda and J.D. Gross
 - ~\$2.1M Home Repair Grants*

One Mile Radius

- OMR Allocations FY13-FY25: \$10.5M
 - ~\$6.3M allocated through HNI and DOP for OMR projects and community grants
 - ~\$4.2M allocated to community and agency-led projects, such as:
